Executive Summary:

This poll of 1,290 Jacksonville, Florida likely voters was conducted from August 17th to 18th, 2019. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of July 9th, 2019. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the City of Jacksonville, Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the City of Jacksonville.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for City of Jacksonville. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within City of Jacksonville, Florida.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 1,290 and a 2.7% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
